

Find the Subject Complement

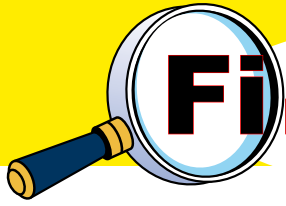
A subject complement is an adjective which follows a linking verb and modifies the subject of the sentence.

Example: The man became furious at the delay.

In this sentence, *became* is the linking verb. The subject complement is *furious*, as it modifies the subject of the sentence *man*.
