Past and passed sound alike, but their meanings are different.



*Past* may be a noun meaning *a time gone by*. It may also be an adjective meaning *in a time before*. It can also be an adverb meaning to go by, or a preposition meaning *beyond*.

- Example 2: She hasn't called me in the past few days.
- Example 3: The principal smiled as he walked **past**.
- Example 4: Our house is past the park.

*Passed* is the past tense of the verb *to pass*. It has many meanings, such as to give something, to succeed at something, or to move ahead.

- Example 1: She **passed** the potatoes to her mother.
- Example 2: He passed his test.
- Example 3: Henry **passed** Thad in the race.
