Since may be used as a conjunction, a preposition, or an adverb. It means during a time period or because.

Example 1: She's been here **since** dawn.

Example 2: I've missed you **since** you left town.

Example 3: He has **since** traveled to Africa.



Sense may be a noun meaning a feeling or intelligence. It also means one of the body's abilities, such as seeing or hearing. It may also be a verb meaning to feel or perceive.

Example 1: He had a **sense** something was missing.

Example 2: She lost her **sense** of smell.
