Commonly Confused Words: **Weather vs. Whether vs. Wether**



Weather, whether, and wether sound a little alike, but their meanings are different.

Weather acts as either a noun, a verb or an adjective. All of its meanings are related to the atmosphere, like rain, storms, or sun.

Example 1: The **weather** will be stormy today.
