Example: I like peas, carrots, and potatoes.

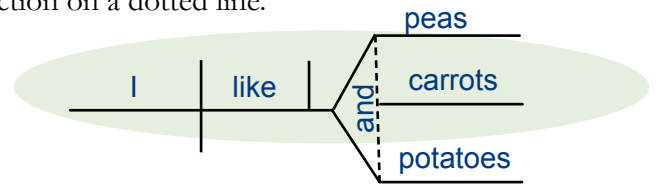
