Improving Sentence Patterns: Varying Dialogue

hen writing dialogue, a good writer will continually change the way the speeches are written. This makes reading the dialogue more interesting. A good writer will move the speech tags, or the "Mary said" part, to the front, back, or middle of the speech.

A good writer will also change the order of the speech tag and use other words besides *said*.

Example 1:

"Do you like apples, or do you prefer bananas?" Mary said.

Change to: "Do you like apples," Mary said, "or do you prefer bananas?"

or: Mary said, "Do you like apples, or do you prefer bananas?"

Example 2:

"Do you like apples," asked Mary, "or do you prefer bananas?"
