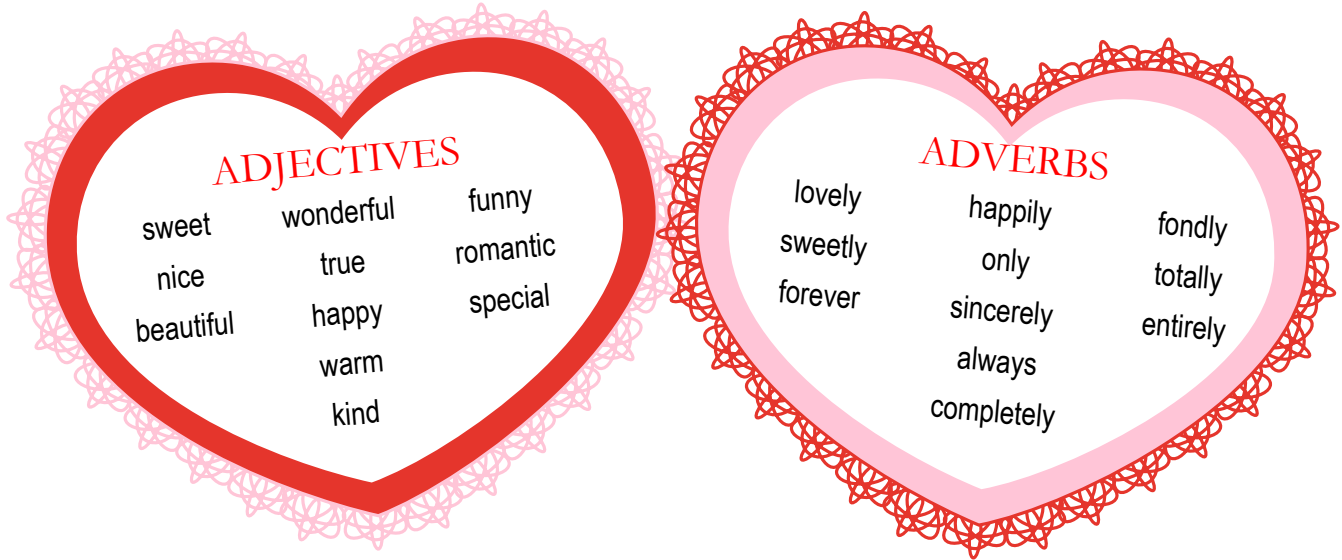

# Valentine's Day Adjectives and Adverbs

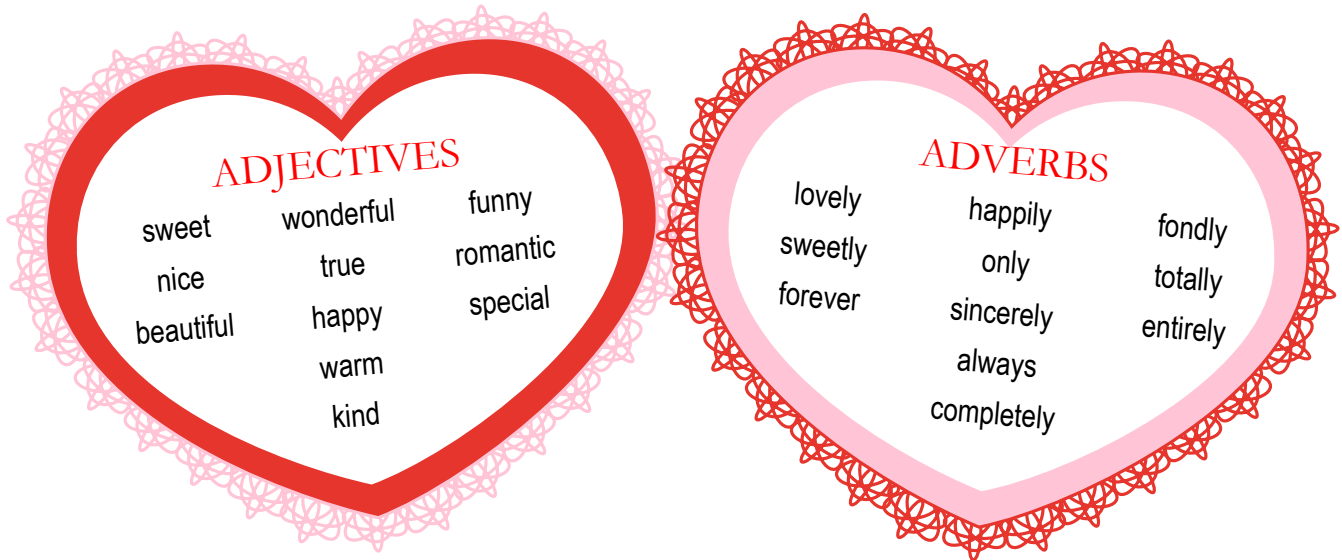
