## **Past Perfect Continuous**

The past perfect continuous verb tense, sometimes called the past perfect progressive, is the present participle form of a verb used with *had been*.

Past tense: I ate.

Past perfect: I was eating.

Past perfect continuous tense: I had been eating.

The past perfect continuous tense is used for showing an action that was ongoing or happening continually in the past and ended. It can also show a cause and effect.

**Example 1:** She *had*been looking for a red
dress but bought a blue
one instead.
