Commonly Confused Words: Role vs. Roll



Role and *roll* sound alike, but their meanings are different.

Role is a noun meaning a position or character.

Example 1: She took the mother's **role** with the baby birds.

Example 2: John will play the **role** of Hamlet.

Roll may be a verb or noun. It has many meanings. As a verb it often means to move over and over in a circle. As a noun it sometimes means something that is wrapped up, a list, or a piece of bread.

Example 1: We saw the rock **roll** down the hill.

Example 3: Your name is on the honor **roll**.

Example 2: Please hand me the **roll** of tape.

Example 4: She put the cheese on a **roll**.
