Irregular Plural, Possessive



"S."

Remember that some nouns have irregular plural forms.

- For nouns that end in "ch," "sh," "x," "o," or "ss," add "es."
- For some nouns that end in "f," or "fe," change "f" or "fe" to "ves."
- For many nouns that end in "y," change "y" to "ies."
- For some nouns that include "oo," change "oo" to "ee."
- Some irregulars have to be memorized: men, women, children, cacti.
