# Passing the Puck: Direct Objects in Sentences Part 2

Not all sentences with an action verb will have a direct object. If there is no logical answer to the question "what?" or "whom?" then there is no direct object.

## **Example 1: Jack played on Friday.**

Question: Jack played what? Answer: There is no answer in Example 1.

A direct object can be added to the example.

## **Example 2: Jack played hockey on Friday.**

Question: Jack played what? Answer: hockey In Example 2 the direct object is *hockey*.
