

Sentence Diagramming: Direct Address

A direct address is when a speaker names the person to whom he is speaking. In sentence diagramming, the direct address has no particular meaning to the sentence, so the name is put above the subject.

Sam, you are late again!

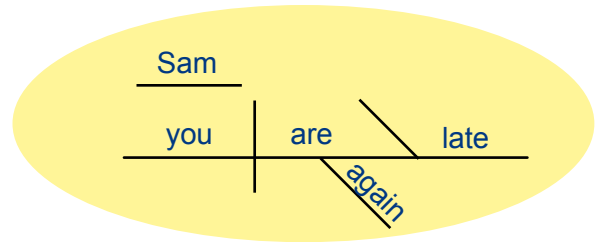
