Sentence Diagramming: Intensive Pronouns

A intensive pronoun is a pronoun ending in *-self* or *-selves* that is used for emphasis in a sentence but has no other function. It can be removed from the sentence without changing the meaning. In sentence diagramming the intensive pronoun is put in parentheses after the noun it refers to.

Example: I myself like mysteries.

I (myself)	like	mysteries




