## Spelling Rule Exceptions for Plural Nouns: No S at All!

A plural noun means more than one. The word *toy* means one toy; the word *toys* means more than one toy. To make an English noun plural, we usually (but not always!) add an *s* to the end of the noun. However, there are many nouns that do not use an s at all. Some words are both singular and plural, such as *deer* which can mean one deer or many deer. Other words use a whole new word as a plural, such as the plural of *child* is *children*.
